




MUSICIANS FOR HARMONY

Musicians For Harmony presents annual “Concerts for Peace” in New York City with such renowned classical musicians as the Guarneri, Juilliard, Orion, and Shanghai Quartets; pianists Leon Fleisher, Claude Frank, and Jonathan Biss; violinist Anne Akiko Meyers; and cellist Carter Brey.

In addition, our resident multicultural ensemble Musique Sans Frontières (“Music Without Borders”) performs on every concert. Organized by Musicians For Harmony’s Artistic Director Patrick Derivaz, these artists represent a blending of different cultures who share a desire to foster global harmony through their music-making.

Each program features a world première performed by an artist from another country, such as Lebanese oud player Bassam Saba, Iranian ney player Siamak Jiangiri, Chinese pipa player Wu Man, Malian kora player Yacouba Sissoko, and Greek-Israeli bouzouki player Avram Pengas.

A BOUT US

Musicians For Harmony was founded in the wake of September 11, 2001, to foster and advance peace among individuals of different cultures, ethnicities, and religions through musical performances, educational activities, and cross-cultural exchange.

Founder and Executive Director



Allegra Klein is a violinist, educator, and arts administrator from New York City. After graduating with a degree in music from Harvard University, she trained in the Suzuki violin method at the School for Strings in New York. She has since worked for Carnegie Hall, Sony Classical, the Marlboro Music Festival, and the New York Youth Symphony, and in October 2001, she founded Musicians For Harmony.

In 2003, Ms. Klein traveled to Baghdad to bring music and supplies to the Iraqi National Symphony Orchestra, and returned this year to participate in the first-ever Iraqi Summer Arts Academy. In demand as an arts education and cultural affairs specialist, she has served on panels for the United Nations, the League of American Orchestras, the NYC Department of Cultural Affairs, and the Westchester Arts Council.

Bass player Patrick Derivaz studied music at the Conservatoire d'Aix en Provence in France and now lives in New York, where he works as a musician, composer, producer, and engineer. Over the years he has been involved in all styles of music, including classical, world, rock, and soundtracks, with some of the best musicians in these domains.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

“Music of the World” Workshops

Musicians For Harmony has developed a series of workshops for New York City public school students, ages 12 to 15, which introduce rudimentary concepts about the music and culture of other countries. Our pilot program débuted in May 2007 at the School for Human



Rights in Crown Heights, Brooklyn, and featured performers from China, India, West Africa, Lebanon, and South America. Additional workshops are planned for 2007-2008.

Iraqi Summer Arts Academy

The first-ever Iraqi Performing Arts Academy was held in northern Iraq in July 2007. Organized by American Voices with support from the U.S. State Department, this historic event brought together over 350 musicians, dancers, and actors from all over Iraq. Musicians For Harmony's Executive Director, Allegra Klein, served on the faculty and trained string players and teachers in the Suzuki method, which she introduced to Iraqis for the first time. Future exchanges are anticipated in the coming months.
